FOSW Meeting & Plant Sale a Success!

One of the most important environmental issues today is the impact of non-native invasive plants and animals on the biodiversity of an area. The FOSW helped educate their membership and the general public on this important issue during the recent annual meeting which featured a presentation by wildlife biologist Peter Picone on planting native species. Pete provided an overview of the choices that can be made when planting and landscaping a backyard. For example, rather than planting invasive species such as barberry or winged euonymous, Pete advocated choosing native blueberry instead.

Invasive species can dominate a landscape and impact the wildlife associated with the habitat. Native wildlife have evolved to feed on native plants. Invasives often do not provide the same nutritional value as native plants.

A native plant sale followed the presentation. Earth Tones Nursery, from Woodbridge, offered many great plants for wildlife. The plants included those that will provide nectar for pollinators; seeds and berries for birds, mammals, and turtles; and even some leaves for caterpillars which will later turn into beautiful moths and butterflies!

Open Center Day Attracts 400!

On May 24, the Sessions Woods Conservation Education Center hosted an "Open Center Day" with a variety of activities for families. An early morning bird walk, led by CT DEEP Wildlife Photographer Paul Fusco, spotted over 40 different kinds of birds on the property, including scarlet tanager, yellow warbler, tree swallow, and ruby-throated hummingbird.

"Survivor Skills," a workshop presented by Hillary Clifford, drew over 60 participants! Hillary showed the audience how to pack a backpack and helped the group assembly small survival kits to take home. (See the calendar inside for information on a "Survivor Skills" repeat program in August.)

Other activities include archery instruction with the CT Conservation Education/Firearms Safety Program; a special art class, featuring salamanders, led by local artist Judy Bird; salamander crafts; and the very popular "tattoo" station with Renee Geiger, mom to CT Wildlife Editor Kathy Herz. The Friends of Sessions Woods were on hand to sell books from the book cart and provide information on membership.



Overall, there was positive feedback from the many attendees and the CT DEEP Wildlife Division staff and Friends of Sessions Woods are considering hosting additional "Open Center Days" in the near future.

Salamander Day July 20, 2014, 1:00 to 4:00 PM!

Learn about Connecticut's 12 different salamanders during this special afternoon for families as we celebrate "The Year of the Salamander." Discover what makes salamanders unique in the animal world and why they are considered to be nature's barometers. The afternoon will include a viewing of live salamanders; crafts; art activity with local artist Judy Bird; children's art contest results, and more! Wildlife Division Outreach Program Assistant Hillary Clifton will present a program for children, ages 10 years and older, on tips and skills for surviving in the outdoors. Hillary will introduce participants to map reading and orienteering; how to pack a backpack; and more! Each participant will make a mini-survival kit to take home. Be sure to register early for this "back by popular demand" program. All children must be accompanied by an adult.

September 13, 2014 (Sat.), 10:00 a.m. Stream & Marsh Exploration

Explore the streams and beaver marsh at Sessions Woods with Wildlife Division Outreach Program Assistant Hillary Clifton. Hillary will introduce participants to the critters, including salamanders, discovered in a freshwater stream. Then, the group will walk to the marsh to identify the wildlife found in this unique habitat.

The hike will total over 2 miles roundtrip. Please bring water and wear appropriate shoes since there is a possibility of getting wet feet!
